### **General Information:**


Each half term you will receive a 'Knowledge Organiser' topic overview sheet. Please work through this with your child - especially learning the key facts and vocabulary.

In Year 6, we will be recalling all times tables up to 12 x 12. Please ask your child multiplication and division facts in and out of order. Your child needs to be able to 'instantly' recall these facts without working them out.

You can also support your child's learning by helping them to prepare for their weekly Rock-it stars and Grand Spell tests.

The age-appropriate reading book band for the start of Year 6 is dark red (Stage 17). By the end of the year, your child should be on, or beyond, dark red (Stage 20). Reading, understanding and using many words, is the best skill your child can learn to help them succeed in life.

#### Maths in Year 6

### Counting

Your child needs to be able to count forwards and backwards up to 1,000,000. They need to learn to count in multiples of 6, 7, 8, 9, 25, 50, 100 and 1000.



Age-appropriate skills for your child:

- Count backwards through zero into negative numbers;
- Counting in decimals;
- Recognise prime numbers to 100;
- Recall and use equivalences between simple fractions, decimals and percentages E.g 0.25 = 1/4 = 25%;
- Know the relationships between different units of measure E.g. 1000g = 1Kg;
- Multiply and divide a 4-digit number by a 2-digit number.

Please practise with your child.

# Writing in Year 6

Your child will continue to improve their writing skills during the year. By the end of Year 6 your child should be able to:

- Write in paragraphs;
- Write legibility, fluently and with increasing speed;
- Proof-read their writing to check for spelling and punctuation errors;
- Use verb tenses consistently and correctly throughout their writing;
- Use a range of punctuation correctly within their writing (commas, brackets, dashes, colons, semi-colons etc);
- Correctly spell the words on the Year 5 and 6 spelling list within their writing.
- Describe settings, characters and atmospheres when writing narratives.

Work on these skills during the year to help your child.
