river – A flowing, moving stream of water.

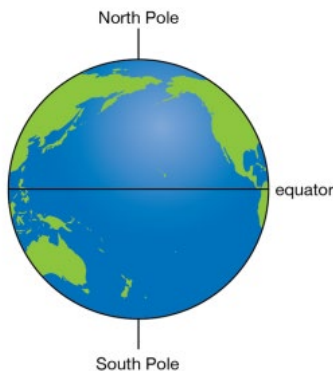
forest – An area filled with many trees.

## Polar animal facts

- Polar animals live in the North or South Pole.
- Most polar animals eat meat; they hunt for fish and smaller animals.
- Polar animals have thick fur; they use their camouflage in the white snow or hibernate during the coldest months.
- Polar animals live in caves made of snow or holes in the ground.

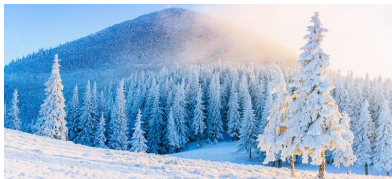
## What do I already know?

What changes happen during winter?

- Snow falls in the winter.
- Trees and plants stop growing.
- The weather gets colder.
- Nights are longer in winter.

## Important Words

<b>winter</b>	One of the four seasons. It is the change from autumn into winter.
<b>season</b>	A part of the year when the weather changes.
<b>change</b>	To make or become different.
<b>weather</b>	What the sky and the air are like outside, such as cold and cloudy.
<b>storm</b>	A heavy fall of rain or snow often with strong winds.
<b>hail</b>	Small water drops that turn into ice and fall from the sky.
<b>sleet</b>	Rain containing some ice.
<b>temperature</b>	A measurement of how hot or cold something is.
<b>thermometer</b>	An instrument for measuring how hot or cold something is.
<b>freezing</b>	When water (liquid) is cooled, it changes to ice (solid). This change is called freezing.
<b>melting</b>	When ice (solid) is heated, it changes to water (liquid). This change is called melting.
