

Geography Whole School Overview

The Geography curriculum ensures that there is progression and the appropriate coverage throughout school. The outcomes from the National Curriculum have been split into four areas: Locational Knowledge, Place Knowledge, Human and Physical Geography and Skills and Fieldwork.

The National Curriculum outcomes are mapped out for each year group, with the sticky knowledge and vocabulary that the children need to learn and remember. Key information and vocabulary are also on Knowledge Organisers which the pupils use in school and at home through the block of learning. These are then referred to throughout the year and across year groups including quizzes and low stakes testing. Therefore, a copy is always kept in class and at home.

Links of concepts and vocabulary have been made throughout the Geography curriculum areas and across other subject areas to enable pupils to recall, revisit and remember knowledge.
