Grace Darling

Grace Darling was born 1815. When she was ten her family moved to live in a lighthouse on Longstone. When she was older she helped her father to look after the lantern, mend fishing nets and keep a watch out for boats in danger.



- On 7th September 1838, a paddle steamer (boat) was sailing from Hull to Dundee.
- It was carrying 60 passengers.
- It was a rough, stormy night and the boat hit the rocks.
- Lots of people died when it crashed.
- William and Grace Darling decided to row out to rescue them.
- They helped all of the survivors onto the boat.
- They took them back to the lighthouse and looked after them.


